What is being at Secondary School like?

Starting at secondary school can be scary. To make things less frightening, we ve made this booklet to tell you about what you can expect, the things we do to help you and some of the fun stuff you'll get up to in your time here. Don't worry! It's going to be great!



What's different? More than one teacher

In secondary school you have a different teacher for every lesson. You will also have a 'form tutor' who will take you for registration and tutor time every day and will look after you at Sandhill View.

Different Classrooms

Instead of one teacher, teaching you all the subjects in one classroom, in secondary school you have a teacher for every subject, each with their own classroom. This means you move around the school to attend your different classes. *Pssst! Check out the map on page 16 to see where all our subjects live at Sandhill View.*





New Subjects!

Some subjects you might not have studied at Primary School. You'll learn a foreign language, play music, learn how to cook or make things in Design Technology as well as learn more about some subjects you have already studied at primary school.

What Else?

You'll find there are a lot more students, up to 800. Toilets are only open at certain times within the school day and if you need to go in lesson time you might get a special pass.





What we do to help...

Transition Week

We try to make your start at Sandhill View a smooth one. To help, we offer Year 6 pupils the chance to visit the school, for a whole week, to familiarise yourselves with the school and meet your future teachers early.

Taster Sessions

We also do fun taster sessions, where primary pupils can spend the afternoon learning more about the 12 different subjects we teach.





Specialist Days

We also offer lots of special subject days such as 'World Pi Day', drama workshops, 'World Book Day', sports days and a chance to have fun in our school pool.

On Your Bike!

Why not hop on your bike to get to school? You can ride your bike right up to the school building and store it safely on site in our secure bike racks near to the entrance of the main yard. Pssst! Don't forget to bring a bike lock!

Breaks & Lunchtimes

You get one 15 minute break in the morning and a 45 minute break at Lunchtime. These give you the chance to chill, have something to eat, catch-up with your friends or visit the toilets (you are not allowed to go to the toilet inside of lesson time). You'll pay for your meals with your fingerprint as our school meals are completely cashless. We'll take your fingerprint on your first day at school and from there your parents can top up your account remotely online or you can by using the top up machines in school.
