Grammar

When asking someone what they want to do and responding you use a tense called the conditional:

¿Te gustaría...? - Would you like to...?

This is followed by the infinitive verb, e.g. **ir** – to go, **venir** – to come, **jugar** – to play

For example, would you like to go to the cinema: **¿te gustaría ir al cine?**

To respond you can say '**me gustaría mucho**' – I would really like to.

Or if you don't want to go '**No, no me gustaría**' - remember you need the double negative we don't use in English.

You can also use the verb **querer** – to want or the verb **poder** – to be able to

(No) quiero – I want to (I don't want to), **(No) puedo** – I can (I can't)

To say I must/I have to – take the verb **tener** and add '**que**' + infinitive

Tengo que lavarme el pelo – I have to wash my hair

Using Reflexive verbs

Reflexive verbs are similar to verbs we use in English, they're often used for things like your daily routine, e.g. wash myself

Me lavo – I wash myself, **Me baño** - I bath myself, **Me ducho** – I shower myself, **Me visto** – I dress myself, **Me peino** – I brush my hair, **Me pongo gomina** – I put gel in my hair, **Me maquillo** – I put my makeup on, **Me aliso el pelo** – I straighten my hair

Other people have their own reflexive pronouns too, you should recognise some of them:

Me lavo – wash myself, **te lavas** – you wash yourself, **se lava** – he/she washes himself/herself, **nos lavamos** – we wash ourselves, **os laváis** - you (pl) wash yourselves, **se lavan** – they wash themselves

¿Te gustaría ir al cine? - Would you like to go to the cinema?

¿Te gustaría.... - Would you like to, **ir al parque?** - go to the park?, **ir al museo** – go to the museum?, **Ir al centro commercial** – go to the shopping centre?, **ir al polideportivo** – go to the sports centre?, **ir a la bolera?** - go to the bowling alley?, **ir a la pista de hielo?** - go to the ice rink?, **venir** – to come, **a mi casa?** - to my house

¿Dónde quedamos? - Where shall we meet?

Detrás de... – behind, **delante de...** - in front of, **enfrente de....** opposite, **al lado de...** – next to, **en...** in/at

Un jersey – a jumper, **un vestido** – a dress, **una camiseta** – a t-shirt, **una sudadera** – a sweatshirt, **una falda** – a skirt, **una gorra** – a cap, **una camisa** – a shirt, **unos pantalones** – trousers, **unos vaqueros** – jeans, **unos zapatos** – shoes, **unas botas** – boots, **unas zapatillas de deporte** – trainers
