<b>Expressive Art</b>	A form of art which expresses emotions or feelings through the style of the work and the materials used.
<b>Theme</b>	<b>In art, theme</b> is usually about life, society or human nature, but can be any other subject. <b>Themes</b> are the ideas explored in a work.
<b>Emotion</b>	a strong feeling such as joy, hatred, sorrow, or fear. When one feels an emotion, there are physical changes such as an increase in pulse, crying, or trembling.
<b>Loui Jover</b>	Loui Jover is an Australian painter and artist. He is known for his artwork in ink wash paintings on vintage book pages.
<b>The Grid Method</b>	<b>The grid method</b> is a way to reproduce and/or enlarge an image that you want to paint or draw. <b>The grid method</b> involves drawing a <b>grid</b> over your photo, and then drawing a <b>grid</b> of equal ratio on your piece of paper.
<b>Primary Colours</b>	A <b>primary color</b> is a <b>colour</b> that cannot be made from a combination of any other <b>colours</b> . (Red, Yellow and Blue)
<b>Secondary Colours</b>	A secondary <b>colour</b> is a <b>colour</b> created from a combination of two <b>primary colours</b> . (Green, Purple, Orange)
