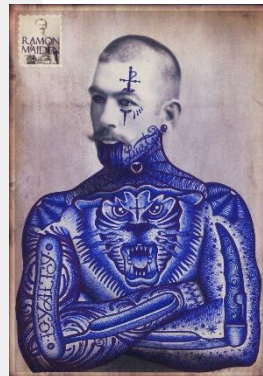
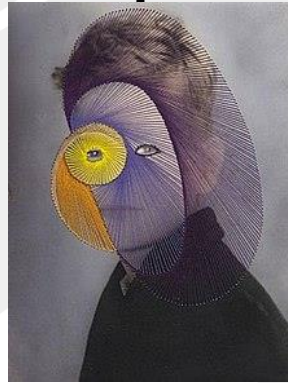

Try creating your own blue biro pen tattooed portrait. Could you represent yourself through the tattoo symbols and stitching?

<b>Tattooing</b>	A tattoo is a form of body modification where a design is made by inserting ink, dyes and pigments, into the skin
<b>Theme</b>	<b>In art, theme</b> is usually about life, society or human nature, but can be any other subject. <b>Themes</b> are the ideas explored <b>in</b> a work.
<b>Emotion</b>	a strong feeling such as joy, hatred, sorrow, or fear. When one feels an emotion, there are physical changes such as an increase in pulse, crying, or trembling.
<b>Message</b>	What is the artwork about? What does it mean? The message of an artwork is what you take away from looking at it.
<b>The Grid Method</b>	<b>The grid method</b> is a way to reproduce and/or enlarge an image that you want to paint or draw. <b>The grid method</b> involves drawing <b>a grid</b> over your photo, and then drawing <b>a grid</b> of equal ratio on your piece of paper.
